We are writing to object to a document titled 'ULSB Consultation: Further Information' in which our academic publications are cited. No author or date is provided for this document, but it was supplied by management to the sixteen staff in your School of Business who are threatened with redundancy. In the document, our work is being used as evidence to define the fields of 'critical management studies' and 'political economy'. The inclusion of someone in these fields is being used to justify their dismissal.

Setting aside the issues of academic freedom of speech which are raised by these redundancies, we absolutely disavow any use of our work to justify the actions of those attempting this purge of academics. The hallmark of any good social science is that it should attempt to be 'critical' of established wisdom, including established 'rational choice' political economy. No business school that wishes to be relevant to the global challenges facing us should ignore the importance of critical scholarship.
